

# Einstein And Jack Benny Are Cast By March Of Time

Physicist And Comedian Will Join In Promotion  
Of America's War Effort On Thursday  
Night Program

A most unusual array of guest stars will appear on the March of Time program Thursday when Albert Einstein, world's No. 1 physicist, and Jack Benny, famed Hollywood comedian, come on the show from opposite sides of the continent to promote America's war program. The broadcast goes on the air at 10:30 p. m. over WEAf.

Speaking from his Princeton, N. J., home on the anniversary of the Balfour Declaration, Prof. Einstein will discuss the war role of the Jewish people and their program for post-war reconstruction. The famed exile from Nazi persecution will be making his first radio address since becoming a United States citizen.
