

# WAVES to Broadcast in Nationwide

Three members of the WAVES will be interviewed at Chadbourne hall today as Madison's part in a nation-wide Navy day broadcast to be carried on WIBA at 1 p. m.

The interview will be conducted by a WIBA staff member, who will present Edith Kingdon Gould, New York City; Laurine Weaver, Los Angeles, and Deborah Kirk, Washington, D. C.; daughter of Rear Admiral Allen J. Kirk of the U. S. navy.

From Washington, Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox will report on the state of the navy, and Admiral Ernest J. King, commander-in-chief of the fleet, will discuss the military situation.

A short-wave roll call will be answered in turn by Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, commander-in-chief of the Pacific fleet; Admiral Harold Stark, commander of U. S. naval force in European waters; Admiral Royal E. Ingersoll, commander-in-chief of the Atlantic fleet, and Vice-Admiral Charles S. Freeman, commander of the northwest sea frontier.

Broadcasts also will come from an aircraft carrier, PT boats, navy blimps, the first army private to arrive in Britain on a convoy, a torpedo station, submarine, Pacific naval hospital, and other points.

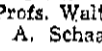
