By popular request, Georgia Gibbs repeats "Cow Cow Boogie." Last week, Lanny and Georgia sang their first duet together. The two will pair again this week for a medley of Irving Berlin tunes. Margo will star in another original Smoke Ring sketch. Herb Shriner offers more comedy in true Hoozier style and Our Town will present a humorous episode. More songs include Georgia's singing of "Mr. Five By Five," and Lanny's solo of "Roving Cowboy." The entire orchestra will join in the finale, "Praise the Lord, and Pass the Ammunition," sung this week by popular request for the third successive time.

The song that Time magazine singled out as possibly the No. 1 war tune will be featured by Dinah Shore on her "In Person" WJZ airing Friday at 8:15 p. m. It's "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition," said to be inspired by the fighting exploits of a chaplain at the attack on Pearl Harbor. Other songs listed by Dinah are "I Met Him on Monday," "He's My Guy" and "Manhattan Serenade."

Martha Scott, former radio soap opera queen who became an overnight film success for her outstanding work in "Our Town," will return briefly to her first love this Friday, Oct. 30, when she appears as guest narrator on "Men, Machines and Victory," 10:45 p. m., over WJZ.
