## Returning to Air, Toscanini to Conduct Program Over WMAQ

The National Broadcasting Co.'s Symphony orchestra will return to the air today with Arturo Toscanini conducting. Highlight of the program will be George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue," with Benny Goodman playing first clarinet and Petty Officer Earl Wild at the piano.
