

Will Discuss Censorship, Propaganda

Censorship and propaganda will be discussed by news experts in two network broadcasts tonight. Byron Price, former executive news editor of the Associated Press who is now director of the office of censorship, will describe how his bureau functions and why apparently innocuous news stories are censored. He will speak on the March of Time broadcast of WMAQ at 9:30. The program also will include analysis of Tuesday's election and another candidate for the No. 1 war song.

America's Town Meeting of the Air, booked on WLS at 7:30, will offer a discussion of "How Should We Fight Our Propaganda War?" Speakers will be William Shirer, author of "Berlin Diary;" Eugene Meyer, Washington publisher; Forrest Davis, newspaper correspondent; and Lisa Sergio, commentator.
