

Training Of Naval Fliers To Be Described Over Air

Series Of Weekly Programs Will Be Broadcast
Over WLW From Station At
Great Lakes, Ill.

The way Uncle Sam turns young Americans into fighting men of the sea, from the time they send home their civilian clothing until they are ready for combat service anywhere in the world, will be described in a new series of weekly programs broadcast over WLW from the U. S. Naval Training Station at Great Lakes, Ill., starting Saturday at 10:15 p. m.

The programs are designed for two purposes. The first is to present a complete picture of the life of a recruit for the parents, relatives and friends he leaves behind. The second is to provide the same picture for young men who may eventually want to join the Navy.

The initial program will out-

line what happens to a naval recruit during his first day at the station. Microphones will pick up orders of a chief petty officer as he orders rent crop of recruits thru the reception center.
