

Firsts Lady to Speak at 3:15 P. M. Today

A talk by Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt from England and a special program marking the 167th anniversary of the U. S. marines will highlight today's radio offerings.

Mrs. Roosevelt will talk for 15 minutes at 3:15 p. m. over WGN. The broadcast will be brought to America by short wave.

The marine broadcast will be heard at 12:30 p. m. over WMAQ. It will include pickups from various parts of the world. No marine will be heard on the show, but persons who have been saved by marines, aided by them, or who have seen them in action will describe their exploits.
