

Women at War to Be Honored on Radio Today

Mrs. Morgenthau, Stage, Screen Stars Will Open Program

America's "Women At War Week" will be launched today with programs at 2 p. m. over WIBA and at 6 over WBBM featuring a talk by Mrs. Henry J. Morgenthau, Jr., wife of the secretary of the treasury, and appearances by stage and screen luminaries.

Mrs. Morgenthau will speak over both WIBA and WBBM, in programs marking the beginning of a seven-day period spotlighting the war activities of American women. WIBA also will present a dramatization entitled "Claudia," during its program.
