## NATION OFFERS 6,000,000 TONS OF SCRAP IRON

NEW YORK, Nov. 25—(AP)—
More than 6,000,000 tons of iron and steel and other scrap for manufacture into tanks, ships, planes and guns was credited today to the newspapers' united scrap metaly drive by Richard W. Slocum, chairman of the campaign.

Slocum said that altho the official collection ended more than a mouth ago, many drives still were, in progress in some states. Newspapers in other areas, he added, were continuing salvage collections.

Because of these continued campaigns, he explained, it was impossible to compile complete totals altho the national average already, is nearly 82 pounds for every man, woman and child.
