Two California Physicians To Test Device Now Aiding In War Effort

The affinity which has always blended talents into a prize-winning combination for a radio audience by Bette Davis and "the President" Nov. 29, at 12:30 p. m. EWT. Davis will be the narrator for the program directed by Oboler.

The brain-wave machine, developed by two physicians, is the latest scientific device to find a place in the nation's war effort. The dramatic story of this machine, originally designed for peacetime purposes, will be told on WEAF's public service feature, "Unlimited Horizons," during the broadcast, Nov. 29 (WEAF, 11:30 p. m., EWT).

This is the third and concluding topic in a series of discussions on "Democratic Government in Crisis."

Recovered from their mild attack of gobbler gorging, Peggy Joan and Marianne Moylan, will present another group of favorites during their program Nov. 29, at 5 p. m., EWT, over WJZ.

Leopold Stokowski has selected an all-Tchaikovsky program for his symphony orchestra concert of Nov. 29 (WEAF, 5 to 6 p. m., EWT). On the broadcast will be heard the Russian composer's Symphony No. 5 and his overture to the Ostrovsky drama, "The Storm."

"Tommy Atkins," the Johnny Doughboy of the British Army, will be introduced to America on the "Britain to America" broadcast from London, to be heard over WJZ Nov. 29, at 6:05 p. m., EWT. Pipe Major MacDonald, and his bagpipes which embody one of the oldest and strongest "esprit de corps" traditions of the British Army, will also take a prominent part.

If "Leona the Horse" can make it, that four-footed successor to Jack Benny's late horseless carriage will transport her master's wandering minstrels across the burning sands to Palm Springs, Calif., Nov. 29. There, the troupe is scheduled to put on its weekly radio show before an audience of tank corps personnel, glider pilots and other service men (WEAF, 7 p. m., EWT).

Inaugurating its eighth season, the Metropolitan Auditions of the Air will present the first two candidates for operatic fame and fortune when Regina Resnik, a dramatic soprano, of New York City, and William Hargrave, a bass baritone of Philadelphia, will be heard over WJZ, Nov. 29 at 6:30 p. m. (EWT). Vying for a \$1,000 award and a contract to sing with the Metropolitan Opera Co., the young artists will be the first to sing each Sunday for a total of 16 broadcasts.
