Songs of the Armed Forces ranging from "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition" marking the first anniversary of Pearl Harbor on the Dec. 6, "Family Hour" broadcast without and Deems Taylor (WABC 5-5:45 p. m.)

Marjorie Main, who created something several weeks ago with her humorous verbal McCarthy, will put in another guest appearance on the program Dec. 6 at 8 p. m. over WEAF.

"Is the \$25,000 Salary Limitation Justifiable?" will be the topic to be discussed on the "Wake Up, America" program of Dec. 6, at 3:15 p. m. over WJZ.

Speakers will be Congressman J. William Ditter, from Pennsylvania; Channing Pollack, noted playwright and author, and James Carey, representing the Congress of Industrial Organizations.

High spot of the week marking America's first year of conflict will be the program of Dec. 6 over WABC at 9 p. m. presenting "Panorama of America at War" with Raymond Massey, noted stage and film star, in a highlight called "So Long, Son" and as co-narrator with Conrad Nagel.

Jack Benny's autumn-long build-up for his New York appearance in person is about to reach its climax, Dec. 6, marks the final broadcast from Hollywood before the gang—except Phil Harris and his orchestra—strikes out for Manhattan (WEAF, 7 p. m.)

Andre Kostelanetz plays host to Walter Cassel, American baritone just signed by the Metropolitan Opera Co., and Rex Stout, chairman of the Writers' War Board, over WABC, Dec. 6, at 4:30 p. m.

An unusual program commemorating the attack on Pearl Harbor will be broadcast by WEAF, Dec. 6 (2-2:30 p. m.)

"The Man Who Missed a Year," title of the program is an isolationist suddenly rendered unconscious on Dec. 7 before news of the Pearl Harbor attack became known. His mind returns one year later but he hardly can trust it.

Two young singers from opposite ends of the nation will make their bid for operatic fame on the "Metropolitan Opera Auditions of the Air" program of Dec. 6, to be broadcast over WJZ at 8:30 p. m. They will be Laura Castellona, lyric soprano, of Rochester, N. Y., and Hugh Thompson, baritone, of Tacoma, Wash.

Doreas, the guest within the house, will learn by experience that a movie script will not assure the road to happiness, and Kathy will have a difficult time deciding between love and justice on "Those We Love" Dec. 6, at 2 p. m. over WABC.

Two works of Johanne Sebastian Bach, freely transcribed for symphony orchestra by Leopold Stokowski, will be presented by the symphony orchestra, Dec. 6 (WEAF, 5 to 6 p. m.) with Stokowski himself on the podium. Schubert and Wagner compositions also will be heard on the conductor's fourth program of the season.
