Kate Smith To Pay Back Social Call When She Visits "Duffy's" On Tuesday; Herbert Marshall To Aid Gracie Allen

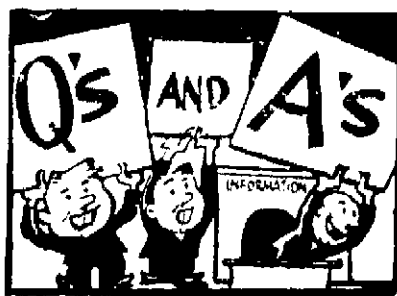
