The life of Eddie Rickenbacker, from his boyhood days when, fatherless, he had to work to help support his family, to his recent return from the jaws of death in the Pacific, will be dramatized by the Little Blue Playhouse on Saturday, at 11:30 a. m. over WJZ.

New York and Hollywood contribute some of their best talent for "Over Here" on WJZ Saturday at 7 p. m. From Hollywood come Betty Grable, Preston Foster, Joan Davis as guests and the Gordon Jenkins orchestra, The Gotham group embraces Clifton Fadiman as master of ceremonies with Jane Froman, Lanny Ross, John W. Vandercook and the David Brockman orchestra. "Over Here" is under joint sponsorship of OWI and the Treasury department.

Joan Blondell, wife of Dick Powell and recently returned from a camp tour of Newfoundland, visits her husband's "Campana Serenade" Saturday (WEAF, 10:15 p. m.) for the express purpose of wishing a Happy New Year to Uncle Sam's fighting men all over the world.

"Lohengrin" will be the opera to be broadcast over WJZ on Saturday at 2 p. m. with Lauritz Melchior appearing in the title role of the famous Wagner production.

Continuing with his idea of one central theme for each of his "Saturday Music Matinee" programs, Dr. Frank Black devotes his Saturday airing over WEAF at 2 p. m. to "Instrumental Music from Famous Operas." Included are "Prelude to Act 3" from "Lohengrin," "Meditation" from "Thais," Overture to "Merry Wives of Windsor," "Intermezzo II" from "Jewels of Madonna," Overture to "William Tell," "Dream Pantomime" from "Hansel and Gretel" and "Triumphal March" from "Aida."

Peggy Wood, of the current Broadway hit "Blithe Spirit," and Walter Compton, radio commentator and emcee, are guest armchair sleuths on "The Adventures of Ellery Queen," Saturday (WEAF, 7:30 p. m.).

Winners of past quizzes in the Frank Crumit-Julia Sanderson series return for an all-star question and answer session, on that WEAF series on Saturday, at 8 p. m. On the women's team will be Frances Donlon, Powers model; Margaret Ostendorf, of New York Institute for the Blind, and Betty Colclough, newspaper woman. The men's team will be made up of Barrett Herrick, broker; Ted Taffner, instructor at the New York Institute for the Blind, and F. Thomas Hill, winner in the program's husbands vs wives competition.

Second of the weekly Boston Symphony orchestra concerts to be broadcast over WJZ on Saturday, from 8:15 to 9:15 p. m., will consist of the works of three outstanding Russian composers — Rimsky - Korsakov, Moussorgsky and Shostakovitch.

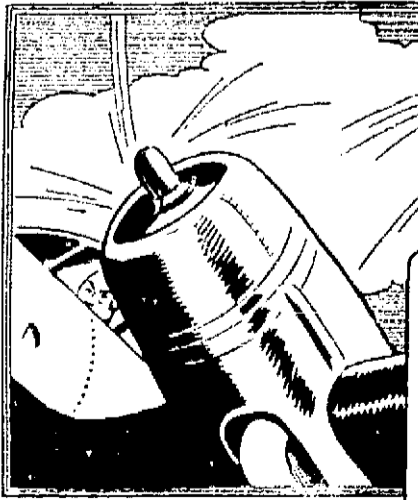
