

# Ambassador Grew Sounds Warning Against Japanese

Labor And Industry To Discuss: "Must Civilians  
Be Drafted For War Work" In "Wake Up,  
America" Program

The United States' long-time ambassador to Japan, Joseph Grew, will give the American public a warning of the implacability of the Japanese as enemies when he is heard during the "We, the People" program Sunday, at 7:30 p. m., over WABC.

The war-service program also will present Milo Boulton interviewing Robert J. Casey, foreign correspondent of the Chicago Daily News, who has traveled 200,000 miles in covering World War II; Vernon "Lefty" Gomez, star pitcher of the New York Yankees; Henry Dionne, world's champion riveter, and Anne Archer-Burton, a 21-year-old ex-secretary turned defense worker.

Labor and industry will be represented at the "Wake Up, America!" broadcast for Sunday, at 3:15 p. m., over WJZ. Topic of discussion will be: "Must Civilians Be Drafted For War Work?"
