## Dummy Berlins Fail to Confuse U. S. Bomber Pilot

ROYAL AIR FORCE BOMBER STATION Somewhere in England —(U.P.)— Two dummy cities, not one as previously believed, rigged up outside Berlin to mislead Allied fliers had no effect upon the shooting eye of Flight Sgt. H. Goodwin, 22, Wyncote, Pa., who piloted a British Lancaster heavy bomber in Saturday night's smash at the German capital.

Goodwin said he dropped his 2-ton "block-buster" right in the center of the real Berlin.

It has been long known that the Germans have made efforts to confuse attackers by creating a fake Berlin beyond the outskirts of the real city but Goodwin and his mates saw two mock cities, both easily distinguishable from the real thing which did not give the raiders any trouble.
