"Mr. District Attorney" Tears Into Fake Armament Manufacturer In "Case Of The Talking Knave"

A story of raw drama involving the lives of the "Mayor of the Town" and his friend, the judge, will be unfolded on Lionel Barrymore's WABC program Wednesday at 9 p. m.
