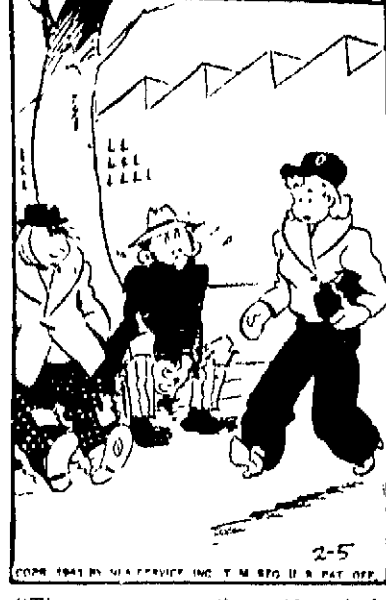
tures of the Thin Man", on Friday, WABC 8:30 p. m.
