COLUMBUS, O., Feb. 17 —
(INS)—Income tax collections in
the Columbus internal revenue
district registered a 45 per cent
increase during January over the
same month a year ago, altho the
number of individual returns filed
was 40 to 50 per cent below Jan-
uary of 1941. The same situa-
tion was true in the state's three
other internal revenue offices at
Cleveland, Cincinnati and Toledo.
