

Kate Smith And Crew Will Broadcast From Navy Yard

"Blondie" To Cut In From Hollywood To Join "Ed" Archie Gardner's Guest List

Kate Smith and her merry musical crew will visit the U. S. Navy Yard at Philadelphia, where some of our biggest battleships are built, for her Variety hour broadcast with Ted Collins, comedian Henry Youngman, Ted Strater's chorus and Jack Miller's band, over WABC, Friday at 8 p. m.

"Blondie," whose adventures usually are heard Mondays via WABC, adds a Friday night broadcast to her schedule on Feb. 19, when she joins Ed "Archie" Gardner on the "Comedy Caravan" guest list, for the broadcast at 10 p. m. over WABC. "Blondie's" adventures will be cut in from Hollywood, while the rest of the show featuring Gardner along with the show's regulars, Herb Shriner, Lew Lohr, Lanny Ross, Georgia Gibbs and Xavier Cugat's orchestra, will originate in New York.
