Frank Morgan Departs From Comedy Roles To
Appear Monday In Dramatic Part In
"Ceiling Unlimited"

"The Lady Is Willing," with George Brent and Kay Francis, is the way the marquee will read on the Radio theatre, Monday. The full-hour dramatic show is carried by WABC at 9 p. m. (EWT). Producer Cecil B. DeMille has chosen a popular comedy in which Kay Francis will portray a glamorous stage-star who is suddenly overcome with mother love when she chances upon an abandoned baby. George Brent is the doctor-husband.

Departing from his usual comedy roles, Frank Morgan plays a dramatic part when "Ceiling Unlimited" presents "Flight Surgeon," on Monday at 7:15 p. m., EWT over WADC. The story deals with how America's fighting flying men are kept in physical condition for their trying work.
