

"The Today Tomorrow" To Be On Author's Playhouse

Richard Haydn Will Drop In On Sammy Kaye And Red Barber Broadcast Wednesday

"The Today Tomorrow," Margaret Prescott Montague's story of a legendary giant whose strength hauls tomorrow into today to save a child's life, will be presented on Author's Playhouse, Wednesday (WEAF, 11:30 p. m., EWT).

Richard Haydn, expert on "fishes of all types," drops in on Sammy Kaye and Red Barber on Wednesday on the broadcast over WABC at 8 p. m. (EWT).

Haydn, who is reported to be en route to his native England shortly to join the armed service, will adopt his "professorish" manner of speech to tell Sammy Kaye a thing or two.

Pvt. Tyrone Power, screen hero, just out of a Marine boot camp, is to get even with Eddie Cantor for the latter's recent radio version of TV's film, "The Black Swan," when they meet at Marine Barracks, Camp Elliott, San Diego, Calif., for a "Time to Smile" broadcast, Wednesday over WEAF at 9 p. m., EWT.

"Laurie, Laurie," a story of murder and madness and a little girl who loved her doll too well, will be brought to the "Manhattan at Midnight" program, Wednesday by "Story Teller" Jim Ameche.

Jan Peerce, tenor star of "Great Moments in Music," will be able to appear on the special United Nations program to be presented Wednesday over WABC at 10 p. m., EWT. Others who will be heard are Jean Tennyson, soprano, and Robert Weide, baritone.

more urgent attention, "Mr. Disraeli Attorney" tracks down a group of criminals who dodge priorities by the simple expedient of stealing whatever they need, in "The Case of the Part-Time Patriot," on Wednesday, at 9:30 p. m., EWP, over WEAF. Isabel Manning Hewson, raconteur for "dinner tonight," will tell the story of Ned Kelly, most famous outlaw in Australian history, during her "Morning Market Basket" program on Wednesday, at 10 a. m., EWT, over WJZ.
