

OWI Director Davis to Start Series of Broadcasts Tonight

Elmer Davis, director of the Office of War Information, will begin a series of weekly, 15-minute broadcasts at 9:45 tonight over WIBA. In announcing the programs, Davis laid down these rules for himself.



"They will not carry news which has not already been available to the press and radio . . . The broad-casts will be factual and will attempt to summarize and clarify important war developments in order to promote clear understanding of the nation's wartime problems . . . Every effort will be made to make each broadcast responsive to the questions uppermost in the minds of the public."
