

# "Air Transport Command" Featured On Air Monday

Jan Struther, Author Of Book From Which "Mrs. Miniver" Was Made, On "Information, Please"

Agnes Moorehead, noted radio actress (heard regularly in "Mayor of the Town" and "Blondie") who was named the best screen actress of the year by the New York film critics for her role in "The Magnificent Ambersons," plays the stellar part in the "Ceiling Unlimited" broadcast of "Air Transport Command," Monday, at 7:15 p. m., E.W.T., over WABC. "Air Transport Command" tells the story of a less-than-glamorous side of aviation in war: that of hauling men, ammunition, artillery, tanks and other supplies to the front lines by plane. Miss Moorehead is heard as the secretary to a major who directs the activities of the Air Transport Command.

Jan Struther, author of the novel from which the Oscar-winning movie "Mrs. Miniver" was made, will make her twelfth appearance as a guest expert on "Information, Please" Monday, at 10:30 p. m. (EWT) over WEAf. She first appeared on the program in 1940, shortly after publication of her famous novel.
