Mrs. Lou Gehrig, widow of Lou Gehrig, baseball's famed "Iron Man," will be guest of Bill Stern on the Sport News at 9 tonight over WIBA. Gehrig's marriage to Eleanor Twitchell marked a turning point in his baseball career. Married the day before the 1933 season ended, in 1934 Gehrig presented his bride with four precious American League crowns—the top batting place, the most valuable player award, and first places in home runs and runs batted in.
