RAF Pounces on Ruhr Valley

Attacks Duisburg Two Nights

LONDON — (U.P.) — Royal Air Force bombers struck Germany's strongly-defended industrial Ruhr valley for the second straight time Friday night, loosing most of their explosive and fire bombs on the inland port city of Duisburg in a 15-minute "thunderbolt" attack.

Coastal command planes earlier in the night joined the latest around-the-clock air offensive, which began in daylight Thursday, with torpedo attacks on
