Frankfurter, MacLeish To Speak For Library Of Congress; "Duffy's" Adds Guitarist

Supreme Court Justice Felix Frankfurter and Archibald MacLeish, librarian of Congress, will be heard in an exclusive half-hour broadcast on WEAJ on Tuesday, at 4:30 p. m. (EWT), on the occasion of the Thomas Jefferson Bi-Centennial. Justice Frankfurter will deliver the main address on "Thomas Jefferson" and will be introduced by MacLeish. The addresses will be part of a Library of Congress commemoration of the Bi-Centennial, which will be held in Coolidge auditorium.

Warning Given On Tire Abuse

CLEVELAND, April 13 — (AP) — More than one-third of the tires on automobiles parked outside 45 midwestern war plants were improperly inflated, a regional Office of Price Administration survey disclosed today.

Clifford J. Houser, OPA regional executive, announced as a result of this finding, war plant transportation committees are being enlisted in an inspection drive to prevent "tremendous waste of our rubber supply resulting from improperly inflated tires."

"We are asking plant transportation committees to approach the problem from a purely selfish standpoint in agreeing to establish their own parking lot or inspection service," Houser declared. "As a part of their interest in having their workers give uninterrupted attendance at their jobs, these committees should insist upon proper care of the tires.
