Lauritz Melchior, Famed Tenor, To Guest On Bill Stern Sports Broadcast Saturday

Lauritz Melchior, world-famous tenor and Metropolitan Opera star will guest on Bill Stern's Sports Newsreel Saturday, at 10 p. m. EWT over WEAF. Melchior, the first opera personality to appear on the popular Saturday evening program in its four and-a-half years on the air, is a crack pistol shot and ardent hunter.
