

Balloon Expert to Be Guest on 'Salute to Youth' Program

Count Carlo Sforza, leading anti-Fascist, will speak over WHA at 11 a. m. Wednesday. He will be guest on Prof. Chester Easum's series on modern European series. Sforza's subject will be "Italy in the 20th Century."

Ward T. Van Orman, internationally known balloon expert who developed the rubber life rafts carried in American war-planes, will be guest on Salute to Youth over WIBA at 6:30 tonight.
