COMMISSION IS FAVORED

COLUMBUS, O., May 15—(AP)—A 13-member commission to delve into "causes of the present plight of small business in Ohio" would be created if the house approves senate-passed legislation. The commission, which would have a \$10,000 operating fund, would be charged with developing "a program which shall prevent or effectively minimize small business failures."
