Trumbull will tell the story of maritime service and Coast Guard cooperation in delivering the goods to the fighting fronts.

Glamorous Lucille Ball, the screen star, joins Groucho Marx on his "Blue Ribbon Town" program Saturday, at 10:15 p. m. (EWT) over Station WABC, in a nostalgic and very gay Gay Nineties routine. Highlight will be Groucho's presentation of the touching ballad, "I'm Carrying a Torch for the Old Back Porch."

Frank "Bring 'em Back Alive" Buck will be guest of Bill Stern on "Sports Newsreel" Saturday, (WEAF, 10 p. m. EWT.) The

program will be Bill's last in the Saturday evening spot. Beginning Friday, the "Sports Newsreel" will be heard Fridays from 10:30 to 10:45 p. m. (EWT).

Nelson Omsted, story teller, will present "A Far Cry," a shipwreck story by Capt. William Outerson, on his "World's Greatest Stories" program Saturday, (WEAF, 11:15 p. m. EWT). The story concerns a little boy and his mother cast adrift in a lifeboat after their vessel is wrecked.

Ravel's "Bolero" will be one of the five popular classics to be played by the Boston Pops orchestra on Saturday, at 8:15 p. m., EWT, over WJZ.

Ellery Queen will tell the "Adventure of the Fortune Teller" Saturday, (WEAF, 7:30 p. m., EWT). The story concerns a wealthy spinster, Amanda Moss, and a gypsy fortune teller who sees the future with uncanny accuracy. But Ellery makes a few predictions of his own.
