

Salute to Youth Will Feature Story of Flier Who Saved 18

The feat of Sgt. Harry M. James, who patched up a four-engine plane which was pronounced unsafe to fly, flew it 1,600 miles though he hadn't been taught to pilot it, and carried 18 persons to safety, will be told as the "Service Story of the Week" on Salute to Youth over WIBA at 6:30 tonight.

W. J. Simpson, who invented the rubber "heart" which operates the wing flaps, retractable landing gears, bomb bays, brakes, and other controls of the big bombers, will be the technician to be honored.

Nadine Conner, soprano, will sing "Chinese Lullabye" and "Comin' in on a Wing and a Prayer." She will be accompanied by Raymond Paige and his Young Americans, 40-piece all-youth orchestra, which will play in addition, "Why," "Chopsticks," "Army Air Corps," and "Rhapsody in Blue."
