

Gen. Sturdevant, Who Mapped Alcan Road, on WBBM at 7:30

Brig. Gen. C. L. Sturdevant, the man who mapped the Alcan highway, will be the guest on Death Valley Days at 7:30 tonight over WBBM.

The program salutes the 168th anniversary of the founding of the army engineer corps, of which Gen. Sturdevant is the chief of troops division. He was instrumental in obtaining appropriations to build the Alaskan-Canadian highway, the vital land link between the United States and Alaskan bases, mapped the highway from the air, and supervised its construction.

Death Valley Days will salute the army's fighter-builders with a dramatization of incidents in the construction of the road.
