Tenor Schedules Four Melodies For Monday

Four of the piquant rhythms and lovely melodies of Franz Lehar have been scheduled by Richard Crooks on the "Voice of Firestone" Monday, at 8:30 p. m., EWT, over WEAF.

Continuing the new summer series, Crooks will sing the prolific Hungarian composer's "Only My Song," "Maiden, My Maiden," "Little White Dove" and "Yours Is My Heart Alone."

In the same melodic vein, Alfred Wallenstein and the symphony orchestra will present the overture to "Oklahoma," "Body and Soul" and Noel Coward's "Some-day I'll Find You."
