

'Memo to Hitler' to Feature WIBA Show Tonight at 8:30

John Nesbitt, famed storyteller and commentator, will address a "Second Memo to A. Hitler" during the premiere broadcast of his summer program, *The Passing Parade*. The new series, which takes the place of the vacationing Fibber McGee and Molly, will be heard at 8:30 tonight over WIBA.

It was nearly a year ago, while substituting for the McGees, that Nesbitt broadcast his now-famous "Memo to A. Hitler," of which nearly a million copies were mailed out upon requests from listeners. The Canadian War Finance committee used the talk to further bond sales, and the Office of War Information, overseas branch, delivered copies to fighting men throughout the world.

Nesbitt's dramatic style will be backed musically by the orchestral arrangements of Carmen Dragon, formerly chief arranger for Meredith Willson.
