

Parade Of Spotlight Bands To Salute Mexican Soldiers

Juan Garcia Esquivel Will Be Heard At 9:30 P.
M. Thursday From Campo Militar, Near
Mexico City; Cardenas Will Be Speaker

The soldiers of Mexico will receive a salute from the "Victory Parade of Spotlight Bands," on Friday, when Juan Garcia Esquivel will be heard over WJZ at 9:30 p. m. (EWT) from Campo Militar, near Mexico City. This will mark the first time "Spotlight" show has paid a tribute to any camp outside the confines of the United States. Campo Militar is the largest military training base in Mexico and thousands of men will see the broadcast. Esquivel is the top name band in his country and will feature the Aquila Sisters, Genara Silinas and a group of ballad singers.

As a part of the good will salute between the two countries. General Lazaro Cardenas, head of the Ministry of National Defense and former President of Mexico, will be heard on the program.

INDUCTEES TO GET FURLOUGH OF THREE WEEKS

COLUMBUS, July 2—(UP) — State selective service officials said today that Ohioans inducted after July 15 will receive approximately three weeks furlough instead of the two weeks presently granted.

Army inductees will receive the entire three weeks before reporting for service, draft officials said, but Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard recruits will take their furloughs in two parts.

Comdr. R. H. G. Mathews, in charge of the Navy inspector's office, said the Navy will continue to give inductees a week's furlough before they report and 10 days when they complete "boot" training.
