

# New Programs For Summer Season Open On Air Thursday

"Blind Date," "Music At War," "That's Life—With Fred Brady," And "Hello" Will Be Inaugurated

Three glamour-girl dates for men in the armed service are the engaging prizes to be offered on "Blind Date," a novel radio program which has its debut Thursday over WEAF at 8 p. m. (EWT). The show is a summer replacement for "Coffee Time." Arlene Francis, star of the Broadway success "Doughgirls" and co-quizmaster of "What's My Name?" will act as a feminine cupid in setting up the dates, which will include dining and dancing at New York's famous Stork club "on the house."

"Hello," a weekly musical variety program with Soprano Louise King, the Dinning Sisters, Joseph Gallicchio and an orchestra on a "swing-shift" assignment, will be heard each Thursday for six weeks over WEAF beginning July 8 (10:30 p. m. EWT). The program will be a summer replacement for "March of Time," which returns to the period Thursday, Aug. 19.

"Music at War"—a six week series which will demonstrate that music can be a weapon of war as well as an instrument of peace—will be presented as the Summer Session of the "Music of the New World" program beginning Thursday, (WEAF 11:30 p. m. EWT). The series is an offering of the Latin-American University of the Air.

## SALVAGE WORK ON NORMANDIE IS NEARING END

NEW YORK, July 8 (UP)—Salvage of the former French luxury liner Normandie, lying on its side on the bottom of the Hudson river, was believed to be nearing completion today.

The Navy is building a big observation deck on a roadway overlooking the site where the 83,121-ton vessel, now the U. S. S. Lafayette, has been half-submerged since it was swept by fire Feb. 9, 1912.

The entire superstructure of the vessel has been removed and officials hope to refloat the ship by pumping water from flooded compartments. The ship turned over on its side under the weight of thousands of tons of water and ice that formed when firemen were fighting the blaze.

## FOREIGN NEWS CHIEF ATTACKED

BUENOS AIRES, July 8 (AP) Police disclosed that Frank Breese, 29, of Santa Barbara, Calif., news manager of the Buenos Aires Bureau of the United Press, was injured Tuesday night when assaulted by two well-dressed, unidentified men.

They said the men followed Breese for some distance and struck him from behind with a dull weapon, inflicting a head wound which required eight stitches.
