Jon Hall Will Play Lead In "Silver Theatre"  
Drama, Introduced By Preston Foster,  
New Master Of Ceremonies

Bob Burns, bazooka and drawl, will be the honored guest on "Paul Whiteman presents—," starring Dinah Shore, on Sunday at 8 p. m. (EWT) over WEAJ. When Bob visits the Whiteman-Shore summer airshow he will play a super-special Whiteman boogie-woogie classic arranged for him and his piece of musical plumbing, titled "Concerto for Bazooka"—also featuring some hot spots for piano and guitar.
