

Zoot Suiter Gets Entangled In Web Of Murder Evidence

"Famous Jury Trials" Unfolds Story Of Mexican
Lad Accused Of Murder Of Junior Patrol Mem-
ber In Program At 9 P. M. Tuesday

Zoot-suited Petro Marlo, who figured in a bloody fight between hoodlums and police-sponsored Junior Patrol boys which wound up in the knife murder of Bobby McBride, will be held for the killing during "Famous Jury Trials" Tuesday at 9 p. m., EWT, over WJZ.

Tribute will be paid to the Infantry, the backbone of the fighting forces, on "Salute to Youth" Tuesday, at 7:30 p. m. EWT, over WJZ. On that day, the "Service Story of the Week" will be devoted to exploits of 22-year-old Pvt. Laurence C. Kennedy, Newark, N. J., who has been convalescing in Staten Island, N. Y., from five bullet wounds in Tunisia. The dramatization will tell how Kennedy and two comrades smashed two machinegun nests in the fighting at Mateur. His buddies were killed but Kennedy was picked up and taken to a field hospital. Kennedy will be a guest on "Salute to Youth" when his story is told.

Lieutenant Commander Dudley "Deadly" Morton, skipper of the U. S. Submarine (Censored) that sailed into port sporting a broom lashed to its periscope, indicating a clean sweep of a Jap convoy, will headline Ginny Simms' "Johnny Presents" broadcast Tuesday at 8 p. m., EWT, over WJZ.
