

Former Canada Flier Appears on Salute to Youth Program

The story of Victor Romano, who began fighting the Axis with the Royal Canadian Air force and fought his way through to a private first class rating in the United States army, will be told in Salute to Youth on WIBA at 6:30 tonight.
