Three Jerome Kern tunes, "The Night Was Made For Love" and "She Didn't Say Yes" from "The Cat and the Fiddle" and "Smoke Gets in Your Eyes" from "Roberta." make up the featured medley for Raymond Paige and his "Young Americans" orchestra and chorus, on "Salute to Youth" on Tuesday, at 7:30 p. m., over NBC stations. Nedine Conner, Metropolitan Opera soprano, sings as her solos "If You Please," from the new Bing Crosby picture "Dixie" and Victor Herbert's "Thine Alone." Other orchestral selections are "Put Your Arms Around Me" and "Eighteenth Century Drawing Room." In addition to the music, the program features the Service Story of the Week, and a distinguished guest from the production lines.

## Parents Told Son Killed In South Pacific

ST. MARYS, July 27-- Mr. and Mrs. Henry Kettler of St. Marys have received news from the War department that their son, Staff Sgt. Charles Kettler, 23, was killed in action in the Southwest Pacific area on July 11.

Sgt. Kettler had signed with the Ohio National Guard with a St. Marys unit in Oct. 1940. He received training at Camp Shelby, Miss. and went to Indiantown Gap, Pa. before having been moved to the South Pacific area in 1942. He had been a staff sergeant about three months.

Surviving in addition to his parents are three brothers, Second Lieut. Arthur and Pvt. William Kettler, both in the South Pacific area, and Harold of St. Marys; four sisters, Mrs. Wayne Williams of Dayton, Mrs. Robert Stober of Los Angeles, Calif. whose husband is in the same war district, and Virginia and Eileen, both at home.
