Three leading figures of radio and the films will join a panel discussion Saturday in an effort to decide how those youthful arts may best be used to help insure a permanent peace. The three—Chairman James Lawrence Fly of the Federal Communications Commission; Walt Disney, creator of delightful screen fantasies, and Francis S. Harmon, executive vice chairman of the War Activities Committee of the Motion Picture Industry—will explore "The World of Sight and Sound" on the Inter-American University of the Air's post-war planning series, "For This We Fight" over WEAF at 7 p. m. (EWT.)

Russ Morgan, one of the country's foremost trombone soloists, will be Barry Wood's guest on "The Million Dollar Band" Saturday (WEAF, 10 p. m., EWT). Russ is currently appearing at New York's Roxy theatre where he is driving his dance followers jive-happy.
