

Concert Pianist Josef Hofmann to Play Tonight Over WIBA

Josef Hofmann, pianist who has been on the American concert stage more than 50 years, will make one of his rare radio appearances on the Great Artists program over WIBA at 8 tonight. He will play Mendelssohn's "Rondo Capriccioso," Chopin's "Grande Valse Brillante," and the last movement of Beethoven's "Emperor" concerto. Donald Voorhees' orchestra will open the broadcast with Reznicek's "Donna Diana" overture.
