FEDERAL MONEY HAS NO APPEAL TO MISSOURIANS

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Aug. 13 — (AP) — The Republican-controlled Missouri house of representatives—backing a member's shout of "tell the federal government to take their money and go to hell" — defeated a bill to provide an additional \$750,000 to administer the state's \$69,000,000 social security program.

Republican Gov. Forrest C. Donnell had asked the addition to \$4,460,000 already appropriated after federal officials suggested the federal matching dollars would be shut off if the state didn't administer the law properly.

Deafening choruses of nays greeted amendments which would have sliced the sum to as low as \$340,000. The rejection of the entire appropriation was by a 62 to 60 vote.

THREE NABBED AT OVERHEAD ON S. METCALF-ST

Three persons charged with passing another automobile on the S. Metcalf-st overhead forfeited their bonds Thursday when they failed to appear in Municipal court to face traffic violation charges.
