

Tokyo Raider Guestar Tonight on Johnny Presents Program

The address which President Roosevelt will give before the Canadian Parliament in Ottawa Wednesday will be heard here at 11 a. m. over WIBU and WCFL. The President will be introduced by W. L. MacKenzie, Prime Minister of Canada, and a brief talk will be given by the Governor General of Canada, the Earl of Athlone. Station WIBA will pick up the broadcast at 11:45 a. m.

A member of Doolittle's raid on Tokyo, Capt. Roy Stork, will be one of the guests of Ginny Simms, when she observes the 30th anniversary of naval aviation on her Johnny Presents program tonight at 7 over WIBA. Capt. Stork, who was forced down in China after the bombing, has been stationed in India the past year.
