Horace Heidt Also Broadcasts For Servicemen;  
Story Of Oil Will Be Presented

Jimmy Cash, tall blond tenor from Arkansas, who made his professional debut on the Burns and Allen program two years ago, has signed a new contract with the comedy team and will return to the air with them at 9 p. m. Tuesday over WABC. For his solos on the forthcoming comedy series, Jimmy will have the instrumental backing of an orchestra under the baton of Felix Mills, one of radio's most gifted composers.

Horace Heidt takes his "Treasure Chest" cast to the Maritime Marine Service training school at Sheepshead Bay, N. Y., for his broadcast on reStation WJZ at 8:30 p. m. Tuesday. Among Heidt's enteratiners are Frankie Carle, his partner and pianist; Fred Lowery, the whistler, and Donna and Don Juans.

"The Story of Oil," one of the most precious commodities in modern warfare, will be told during "This Nation at War" when the program is aired at 10:30 p. m. Tuesday over WJZ.
