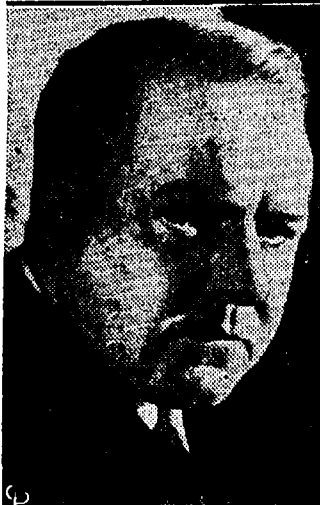

We'll Take Manchuria, Chiang Promises

CHUNGKING — (U.P.) — Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek, making his first address as president of the Chinese republic, repeated on Saturday previous Chinese pledges that resistance to the Japanese "definitely will not cease" until Manchuria has been recovered. He told the opening session of the people's political council that Manchuria was an "integral" part of China.
