

# Premiere Of Four Freedoms Symphony To Be Held Sunday

World premiere of "Four Freedoms Symphony" by Robert Russell Bennett will be given Sunday at 5 p. m., EWT, over WEAJ by a symphony orchestra under baton of Dr. Frank J. Black. Inspired by the Atlantic Charter and four paintings by Artist Norman Rockwell, the symphony is divided into four movements, freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want, and freedom from fear.

When Norman Rockwell, who painted the four freedoms pictures, was told his work would be broadcast Sunday to the nation, he said: "The creation of a Four Freedoms symphony by so distinguished an American composer as Russell Bennett is highly exciting news for freedom loving people thruout the world. That these great principles should be interpreted in music, means that millions of people will come to an even closer appreciation of what all of us are fighting for. Naturally I am honored and delighted by Mr. Bennett's statement that he has based his symphony on my paintings of the Four Freedoms. You may be sure that there will be a lot of ears in the Rockwell family glued to the radio when the symphony has its premiere."

quaintance, in the person of Dr. Robert DeLund, he is presented with a surprise proposition which prompts a great deal of thought on "Those We Love" Sunday, over WEAJ at 7 p. m., EWT.
