## AUGLAIZE JUDGE WILL DECIDE MILLER CASE

WAPAKONETA, Oct. 8—Judge W. T. Copeland in Auglaize-co common pleas court late Thursday, at the close of a three-day hearing, took under advisement the jurisdiction motion in the divorce case of Mrs. Helen Miller, daughter of T. R. Hamilton of Lima, against Gerald Miller of Cleveland, assistant Cuyahoga-co prosecuting attorney.

The case, transferred here from Allen-co where Mrs. Miller filed suit for divorce, is being contested by Miller on grounds that the local court does not have jurisdiction and that he filed similar proceedings in Cuyahoga-co common pleas court.

The defendant claims that Mrs. Miller was on a visit at the home of her parents in Lima when she instituted proceedings against him but that he filed suit for separation in Cuyahoga-co prior to the date that Mrs. Miller filed suit in Allen-co. The Allen-co case was
