Cecil B. DeMille presents "The Letter," a story of drama and suspense, on Monday at 8 p. m., EST, over WABC. Bette Davis and Herbert Marshall will be heard in their original screen roles.

## CIO CHIEF RAPS SOLDIER BALLOT

WASHINGTON, March 6 — (INS) — The pending soldier vote compromise was denounced today by President Philip Murray of the CIO as a "technical absurdity" which would disfranchise servicemen now able to vote.

In a letter to senate and house members, Murray suggested they reject the conference report which approves a predominantly states' right measure. The compromise will be acted on this week.

Murray described the bill as unworkable and declared "its obvious effect would be to harass and bedevil the serviceman to the point where he would give up in despair."

## TWO OHIO AVIATORS AMONG SIX KILLED

SIOUX CITY Ia, March 6 — (AP) — Two Ohioans were among six crewmen of a B-17 bomber killed when the plane crashed in a cornfield five miles north of Merrill, Ia., Saturday, the Sioux City Air Base announced. Three bailed out safely.

The Ohioans killed were 2nd Lt. John R. Everett, son of Mrs. Fanny Everett of Portsmouth, and Cpl. Charles Stephenson, son of Mrs. Edith Stephenson of Zanesville.
