Bricker Raps **Pre-War** Plans

SAN FRANCISCO, April 15--(AP)-Gov. John W. Bricker of Ohio criticized President Roosevelt's pre-war policies in the Pacific in a speech before the Commonwealth club today, declared a change of administration would help the war effort and outlined a four-point platform of his own.

Bricker, a candidate for the Republican presidential nomination, singled out, what he termed a failure to notify the people **S** about Japanese fortification of **S** mandated islands, and the administration's tolerance of oil and iron shipments to Japan for criticism as pre-war policies. T
